# OVERVIEW

Adrian McIntyre is a skilled 6'3" guard with elite scoring ability and proven leadership at the collegiate level. A California native, he established himself as a go-to option at Westmont College, where his offensive versatility, court vision, and ability to create in isolation set him apart. In 2024–25, McIntyre led all of NCAA Division II in scoring with 27.9 points per game, setting both PacWest and Westmont single-season scoring records, including a 51-point performance. Transitioning to the University of San Diego for the 2025–26 season, he brings maturity, production, and a scorer's mentality to NCAA Division I. With his instincts and adaptability, McIntyre projects as a guard with clear professional potential in Europe.

# STRENGTHS


- Elite scoring ability — led NCAA DII in points per game (27.9 PPG in 2024–25).
- Confident three-level scorer (slashing, midrange, and perimeter shooting streaks).
- High efficiency for a high-usage guard (56% FG last season).
- Creates offense for others — solid passer with 3.9 APG.
- Excellent free-throw shooter (78.6% FT) under pressure.
- Strong defensive activity with 2.1 steals per game.
- Proven leader and go-to option; thrives carrying offensive load.

# WEAKNESSES

- Three-point shooting consistency (31.5% last season) still developing.
- Defensive discipline — gambles for steals, can be beaten on rotations.
- Adjustment needed to faster, more physical NCAA D1 competition.
- Can be turnover-prone when double-teamed or pressured.
- Relies heavily on scoring volume; must show ability to impact games without points.
- Needs to improve off-ball movement to fit structured offenses.
- Limited experience against top-tier professional competition so far.

# PLAYING STYLE & PROJECTION

Adrian McIntyre is a dynamic scoring guard who thrives with the ball in his hands. At 6'3", he combines quickness, creativity, and confidence to attack defenses, either finishing at the rim or pulling up from midrange. He's a volume scorer who can take over games, as shown by leading NCAA Division II in scoring with 27.9 PPG. Beyond scoring, he provides secondary playmaking with nearly four assists per game and active perimeter defense. Transitioning to NCAA Division I at San Diego, McIntyre projects as an instant-offense guard, with the upside to develop into a reliable two-way contributor in European leagues.



# COMPARABLE PLAYERS

## Melwin Pantzar (Bilbao Basket, Liga ACB / FIBA Europe Cup – 2024–25)

Pantzar showcased his scoring and leadership during the 2024–25 season with Bilbao Basket, leading the team to a FIBA Europe Cup championship and earning Finals MVP honors. Standing 6'3" like McIntyre, Pantzar delivers reliable scoring—averaging nearly 10 points per game in Spain's top domestic league while maintaining a smooth offensive rhythm and efficient shot distribution. His game reflects similar traits: perimeter threat, basketball IQ, and the ability to shine in high-pressure moments.

## Jerrick Harding (Andorra, Liga ACB – 2024–25)

Harding emerged as the top scorer in Spain's Liga ACB during the 2024–25 season, averaging 20.0 points per game, and earned All-ACB Second Team honors. Like McIntyre, he is a smooth, aggressive scoring guard with the ability to light up the scoreboard consistently in high-level European competition. Harding strikes a balance between volume scoring and efficiency while showcasing composure in one of Europe's toughest leagues—perfectly mirroring the scoring instincts and two-way potential McIntyre brings.



# CONCLUSION

Adrian McIntyre is a prolific scoring guard with the ability to impact games as both a primary offensive option and a secondary creator. His record-breaking season at Westmont, where he led NCAA Division II in scoring, highlights his confidence, efficiency, and leadership under pressure. Now stepping into NCAA Division I with San Diego, he brings maturity, resilience, and a scorer's mentality ready for bigger challenges. With the right opportunity, McIntyre has the tools to translate his production to the professional level in Europe, where he projects as an immediate scoring threat and long-term asset for a club.
