# OVERVIEW

Marcus Tomashek is a versatile 6'6" guard with proven scoring ability and strong two-way potential. A native of Wisconsin, he has developed into Michigan Tech's go-to offensive option while showing steady improvement each season. Tomashek combines size, shooting touch, and a confident slashing game, making him a difficult matchup in the GLIAC. His ability to create his own shot, score efficiently from the perimeter, and defend multiple positions gives him clear professional upside in Europe.

- Needs to continue improving shooting efficiency vs. higher-level athleticism.
- Limited exposure against top NCAA D1 competition.
- Playmaking as a primary point guard is still developing.
- Defensive footwork can improve against quicker guards.
- Must adapt to faster, more physical pro pace.

# PLAYING STYLE & PROJECTION

Tomashek plays with confidence and patience, able to score both on and off the ball. His physical profile and scoring instincts project well to mid-to-upper tier European leagues. With his size, versatility, and ability to create offense, he could fit as a secondary scorer and two-way contributor early in his pro career.



# COMPARABLE PLAYERS

## Kyle Mangas (Helios Suns, Slovenia / FIBA Europe Cup)

Like Mangas, Tomashek was a prolific scorer at the NCAA DII level, showing the ability to dominate offensively against consistent competition. Both have strong size for guards, polished midrange games, and a knack for getting buckets in multiple ways. Tomashek mirrors Mangas' smooth scoring presence and steady pro-ready demeanor.



## Matt Thomas (Former Iowa State / NBA / EuroLeague)

Tomashek's perimeter shooting touch and disciplined approach draw comparisons to Thomas. Both thrive as floor-spacing guards with reliable mechanics and confidence under pressure. While Thomas carved out a career through knockdown shooting, Tomashek shows similar upside as a consistent outside threat who can complement primary scorers at the professional level.



# CONCLUSION

Marcus Tomashek is a rising guard with the tools to succeed at the professional level. His combination of size, shot-making ability, and steady development at Michigan Tech make him an intriguing prospect for overseas clubs.
